WHEREAS, the Town of Ulster previously adopted, pursuant to and in accordance with various mandates, adopted a sexual harassment policy covering its employees, appointees, and elected officials; and

WHEREAS, said policy complied with all applicable guidance at the time of adoption; and

WHEREAS, New York State in the year 2023 issued new guidance in relation to what should be included within a sexual harassment policy; and

Resolution authorizing the Supervisor to negotiate a cancellation of Contract TU-221, Stormwater Channel Improvements for the Town of Ulster, Katrine Lane Stormwater Project award November 3, 2022 (2023-R-248)

Supervisor: In 1967, Miron moved to Town of Ulster/Lake Katrine and construction made it impervious for rainwater. Town has been dealing with erosion on west side of railroad. Due to Central Hudson primary control center project, we were able to construct a stormwater district to correct problems on the west side. Town designed and spent money, received a low \$150,000 bid (vs. the \$600K estimate). Property owner sued Central Hudson and indemnified the town. Bid contractor looking to begin construction or cancel the contract.

Resolution Authorizing the Town Supervisor to Negotiate a Cancellation of Contract No. TU-221, Stormwater Channel Improvements for the Town of Ulster, Katrine Lane Stormwater Project

WHEREAS, the Town of Ulster Town Board previously approved a capital project to correct alleged stormwater and drainage problems in the Katrine Lane area of the Town of Ulster; and

WHEREAS, on August 18, 2022, the Town of Ulster Town Board adopted a resolution to publicly bid the project, "Contract No. TU-221, Stormwater Channel Improvements for the Town of Ulster;" and

WHEREAS, by resolution dated November 3, 2022, the Town of Ulster Town Board awarded the contract to the lowest responsible bidder, Hubbell, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, one of the property owners where most of the improvements were to have been installed has commenced litigation against Central Hudson, and it appears increasingly likely that the Town of Ulster will be impleaded as a third-party defendant; and

WHEREAS, it is not in the best interest of the Town of Ulster to be responsible for construction or other improvements on private property where the record owner is engaged in litigation against the Town; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, the Town of Ulster Town Board hereby authorizes the Town of Ulster Supervisor to cancel Contract No. TU-221, and negotiate said cancellation so as to protect the rights of the Town of Ulster to the maximum extent practicable and feasible

Resolution for iPark87 East Campus Redevelopment Overlay District and Site Plan, P-908 – Enterprise Drive and Boices Lane – SBL 48.7-1-29.110, 120, 130, 140, 150, 160, 170, 240, 250, 270, 400, 500, 600, 700, 800 & 900 (2023-R-249)

Supervisor: In 2011, the town board passed a zoning modification for the IBM east campus called the *Overlay District*, allowing commercial redevelopment on the site. The town planning board now has a proposed development on the east campus. The developer notified the town that they would like to take advantage of that overlay district with some minor modifications, requiring a modification of the zoning code.

In order for this legislative change, we will need to initiate a second SEQRA action. Tonight's resolution authorizes the town clerk to proceed to notice any involved agencies, and that the town board seeks lead agency in the environmental review.

WHEREAS, the Applicant – iPark 87 LLC (aka National Resources) -- has made an amended application to the Town Board, in coordination with the Planning Board, and now seeks Redevelopment Overlay District designation as per the Town of Ulster Zoning Code 190-12.2, as well as site plan approval to redevelop the "East Campus" of the former IBM Kingston facility (formerly a/k/a TechCity), previously foreclosed and owned by Ulster County, and subsequently transferred to the Ulster County Economic Development Alliance prior to sale to current owner; and

WHEREAS, proposed via draft general Comprehensive Design Plan are three (3) components:

- 1. Residential 880 units of multifamily housing constructed in five (5) phases plus complementary non-residential mixed uses;
- 2. Existing Commercial/Industrial Buildings renovation of four (4) existing buildings equaling approximately 743,000 square feet for industrial, commercial and office uses; and

3. New Construction Commercial/Industrial – construction of two (2) new buildings being a 160,000 square foot film studio and a 400,000 square foot warehouse; and

WHEREAS, an integrated element of the first component redevelopment plan will include 24,000 square feet of retail/amenity space, a 19,355 square feet hotel / arts center, and 15,000 square feet "mobility hub"; and

WHEREAS, the applicant has amended an earlier application to now include a request for Redevelopment District zoning designation as noted above, as well as an amended Site Plan application to the Town of Ulster including submitted Part 1 each of the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) Short and Full Environmental Assessment Forms, and a Supplementary Draft Environmental Impact Statement (SDEIS); and, WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Ulster has final review and approval authority for both the Redevelopment Overlay district designation and the site plan application in coordination with the Town of Ulster Planning Board; and,

WHEREAS, said Town Board, in coordination with the Planning Board, has reviewed the original application as well as the amended application as submitted; and,

WHEREAS, at their May 9, 2023 meeting the Town of Ulster Planning Board discussed the original application and unanimously approved a resolution recommending the Town Board declare the Action as Type 1 under SEQRA as well as intent to be Lead Agency; and,

WHEREAS, at the May 18, 2023 meeting the Town Board by unanimous resolution declared this Action as Type 1 as well as its intent to be Lead Agency for this Action; and,

WHEREAS, said Town Board circulated such intent with supporting documentation to all Involved and Interested Parties and has since received no response or objection from any Interested or Involved Party; and,
